NZEI Kua Tae Te Wā Campaign

Thank you for the many positive messages of support regarding our strike day on the 15th of August.

One of the key issues for teachers is the workload and pressure they are under to deliver the learning programmes our children need (and you expect as parents). The days of 'worksheets for everyone' are gone. As parents, you expect your child to receive a personalised learning programme that targets their learning needs in reading, writing and

math. Our teachers work hard to deliver individualised programmes and to achieve this, they must plan and assess learning progress for every child in their groups on a regular basis. This takes a lot of time and expertise; on average teachers work between 50-55 hours a week.

One of the things teachers are asking for is increased resourcing so teachers have the time and resources to better meet the needs of your children. 30% of teachers leave the profession in their first four years, citing pressure and stress as the key reasons.



This is all contributing to a looming shortage of teachers. The strike on the 15th of August is from 7AM to 7PM because this reflects the real time teachers work. Endeavour School is closed for instruction for this period of time and for Health & Safety reasons children cannot attend school. Now is the time to contact friends and family to see how you can support each other if this is a problem for you. We apologise for any inconvenience and thank you for your support.



Kiss & Drop Zone

Some information for our new families who may not be aware of how our "Kiss & Drop" zone in front of our school works:

Please **<u>do not park</u>** and leave your vehicle unattended in this zone. It is intended for parents to drop-off and collect children, without leaving their vehicle.

In the afternoons, the Kiss & Drop Zone is supervised by one or two staff members to assist with delivering students safely into vehicles.

Please do not block our patrolled crossing on the road and if you are unable to get into the Kiss & Drop because it is full, please do not stop on the road as this backs traffic up right down Endeavour Ave.

Fun Facts for Scarlet Fever

There have been a few cases of Scarlet Fever in local schools recently, so our Public Health Nurse has shared some information for families:

Scarlet fever is a bacterial infection caused by certain strains of the group A streptococcus bacteria. Signs and Symptoms of Scarlet fever can be;

a) sudden onset of a sore throat and high fever followed by

b) a rash which appears as pinkish-red spots or blotches that often start below the ears and spreads quickly over the rest of the body. As the spots spread the skin starts to look like sunburn with goose pimples. The rash may last 2-5 days.

c) 'Strawberry tongue'. This is when the tongue is redder than normal and the bumps on the tongue are bigger than normal.

Scarlet fever is very contagious and is spread by sneezing and coughing. Scarlet fever occurs mostly in children aged 4-8 years.

Treatment consists of antibiotics, rest and fluids. It is very important to finish the whole course of antibiotics to prevent complications.

To help prevent the spread of infection in the family **a**) isolate from younger siblings **b**) separate drinking and eating utensils used by the infected child **c**) good hand washing.

Children should be kept away from school until they have received at least 24 hours of antibiotic therapy and there are clear signs of improvement.
